Section 4 First Aid

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

DANGER. Combustible liquid. May be harmful or fatal if swallowed. Aspiration hazard if swallowed. Keep away from heat and flame.

EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists: Get medical attention.

Section 5 Fire Fighting Measures

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Suitable fire extinguishing media:

Use water spray, fog or foam.

Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Combustible liquid. In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst, with the risk of subsequent explosion. Gas may accumulate in low or confined areas or travel a considerable distance to a source of ignition and flash back, causing fire or explosion. Runoff to sewer may create fire hazard.

Carbon Dioxide, Carbon Monoxide

Specific fire-fighting methods:

Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire. No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. Prevent runoff from entering drains, sewers, streams or other bodies of water. Absorb spill with inert material. Absorb unrecoverable product. Transfer contaminated absorbent, soil and other materials to containers for disposal.
